\* While the large majority of these matches will continue through the process and move to the "housed in PSH" category, for various reasons, there will be a small number who do not complete the housing provider intake process, who do not pass a private landlord's qualifications or who decline the housing, and are returned to the Prioritization list to receive an alternate match.

### CES Status Notes

- Established Procedure Review Committee. Members were selected by fellow CoC stakeholders and include: Colette's Children's Home, Friendship Shelter, Health Care Agency, City of Anaheim, Orangewood Foundation, Jamboree Housing, Mercy House, Families Forward, and Family Assistance Ministries. The group has met twice to begin deeper dives around policy and procedural issues.
- Continued recruitment of outreach/in-reach teams for Family populations.
  - Added 3 new pilot family in-reach sites: American Family Housing, Families Forward, Pathways of Hope.
  - Pilot project initiated with OCDE McKinney-Vento Liaisons.
  - Early conversations with SSA FaCT Family Resource Center platform to pilot in-reach project.
  - 14 total outreach/in-reach teams
- Trained all outreach teams on use of Family Vi-SPDAT.

- Rapid Re-Housing (RRH) Written Standards, Access & Barriers Policy, Admission & Refusal Policy, and Prioritization Policy were approved by stakeholders. A recommendation will be brought to the June Executive Committee meeting for with a goal of approval by C2EH in July.
- Adsystech's 3rd Development Partnership meeting will be held next week. Progress on the development of the CE module will be shown and feedback obtained on the next features for development (managing housing inventory, client prioritization and matching).
- Developed and previewed an on-line assessment tool. Once privacy requirements finalized, will be launched for pilot testing and then rolled out system wide.
- Coordinated Entry System Re-Entry working group planning a Jail 101 and Prop 47 training to assist outreach workers, case managers, and those in need of the service.
- Attended the Southern California Action Planning Session for Housing & Healthcare Integration. The TA session will produce a work plan that can be carried out through the Housing & Healthcare Integration working group.
